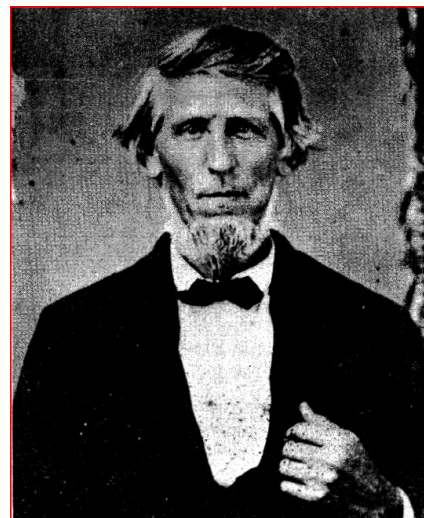
Our dinner and meeting on Saturday night will be held at 5 p.m. at Cracker Barrel, 105 Hoffman Drive, in LaGrange. There's no need to prepay as everyone will be ordering off the menu. We do ask that you let us know how many people will be at dinner. You can email us or use the enclosed form to RSVP.

I am particularly anticipating this year's reunion. LaGrange is close at hand to the Whatley Cemetery where Nancy Paschall Dingler, our common ancestor, is buried. A bit further afield, but certainly within striking distance for any cemetery hound, are the abandoned Bushby Creek Cemetery in Carroll County and the Dingler Cemetery in Douglas County.

Thomas P. Dingler and family are buried in the Bushby Creek Cemetery. Many years ago, Margaret Dingler Winkles "moved heaven and earth" to save this historic old cemetery, and protect it from the timbering that was being done in the area. I have not visited the cemetery since 1980. I plan to relocate it and report on its current condition. Note that Thomas P. Dingler is the son of William Dingler and grandson of Johannes Dingler. You can find Thomas on page 29 of Dinglers of the South.

The family of John Thomas Dingler is buried in the recently documented Dingler Cemetery in Douglas County. I believe that perhaps his father, James Dingler (brother of Thomas P. Dingler), is probably buried there as well. Historically, most attendees at

the Dingler reunions descend from one of these two brothers (or in some cases, both!) If you are interested in a field trip to research these two cemeteries, bring your boots and follow me on Saturday morning. John Thomas Dingler is on page 160 of Dinglers of the South, and James H. Dingler is on page 158.
